

Work at the Local Level

Background

- In 2020, the Virginia General Assembly allowed localities to increase cigarette tax up to 40 cents in 2021.
- Our local planning commission formed a taxation board and our several of localities joined and increased their taxes in late 2021/early 2022

Our Goal

 Educate local legislators on the importance that cigarette tax revenue goes back to those impacted by the tax. To support that, our ask is 5-10% of cigarette tax revenue in FY24 go towards cessation and prevention efforts

Current Progress

Data Gathering

- Reviewed BOS minutes to understand the landscape and dynamics of each board
- Calculated potential revenue to develop the ask
- Researched local tobacco use data, best practice interventions and current local activities

Training Session

• Policy training session with ACS CAN Staff

Educational Sessions

- Presented to the local board of supervisors with our ask
- Outlined stats, trends and impacts with concrete solutions



Next Steps

- Follow up with letters to the BOS re-emphasizing ask
- Reconnect in fall (budget season) to re-engage
- Work with health district to outline their work plan for cessation and prevention
